Kakapo Bike Skills

This week all of the Y5-6 students have completed the level 1 bike skills training with the Let's Go Team. The focus was:

- Bike safety - checked brakes, tyre tread, tyre pressure and the drop test to check and listen for loose parts on the bike
- Helmet fit - checked helmets fit by making sure two fingers could fit under the chin strap and there was a two finger gap from the eye brows to the front of the helmet
- Riding skills - slow riding test to check balance. Learnt arm signals for stopping, turning left & right and how to safely look behind while riding to check for traffic or hazards. Also practiced stopping and getting in the pedal ready position.

The skills taught are extremely important for the children to know and use whenever biking.

Next week the Y6 students will complete the level 2 skills, which involves putting the skills learnt in level 1 into practice on the roads and the Te Henui track.

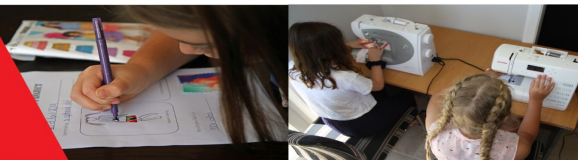
