



Summer sports:

Registrations are closed.

Superstar cricket (NE-Yr 4):

Season runs from 16th October - 4th December. Kiwi cricket (Yr NE - 2 new to cricket). Intro to Incrediball (Yr 2-4 players who have little or no cricket experience) and Incrediball (Yr 3-4 with some cricket experience) are played on Friday afternoons at Lynmouth and Western Parks from 5:30.

Summer Hockey (Yr 3-6) - Kiwisticks (Yr 5-6) , Ministicks (Yr 3-4) Season runs from 17th October to 5th December. Summer hockey is played on Saturday mornings from 9am at the Hobson street Hockey turf.
