Road Sense - Making Safe Choices

- ◆ Respect our neighbours - by not parking over driveways. Do not park on grass verges
- ◆ Don't park in the accessibility carparks - we have families that need to use these. **Only** mobility card holders should be using these spaces and have the card displayed.
- ◆ Yellow lines at the turning end of Arawa street are a **no stopping area at all times**. This is a public road and road rules apply.
- ◆ The police and NPDC parking wardens continue to randomly patrol and check schools before and after school and will issue tickets and fines to anyone infringing road rules.

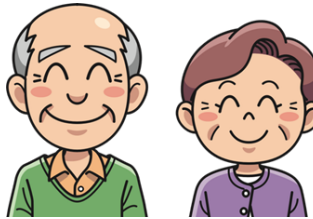

Summer sports:
